1 -Decorate your trunk!

-How elaborate you want to be, is up to you! There are inexpensive trunk decorating kits available from places like Michaels.

2 -Have an activity prepared for children when they come to visit your trunk.

-Activities can include purchased games from Target or homemade games as pictured below.



-Activities can also be items like: Decorating a halloween bag, pumpkin decorating, glitter tattoos or face painting.

3 -All edible prizes must be **NUT-FREE** food items that are pre-packaged or non-edible items.

Examples of nut-free candy include: Starburst, Skittles, packaged Swedish Fish, Nerds, etc. Non-edible items can be purchased at Target, Oriental Trading, or Party City.

4 -Prepare for about 200 visitors to your trunk.

5-All of your items will be donated (you will NOT be reimbursed by the PTO).

What Is Trunk or Treat?

-Volunteers decorate the trunks of their cars.

-Each trunk has an activity for the children and distributes prizes.

-The children walk to each trunk play games, do an activity, and collect prizes.

-Children may dress up in costumes (no weapons and no full-face masks).

-There will be NUT-FREE food at this event.

-Drop in any time between 4:30 and 6pm

-The location of the event is the Field School Parking Lot which will be closed to through traffic. All parking will take place at the adjacent parking lot and Country.
