RE: 2017-2018 Enrollment Report and Projections

---

The school year 2017-2018 enrollment report is divided into three sections. The first section provides the October 1 enrollment data in terms of historical information as well as actual versus projections. The second section provides class size data for the middle and high schools. The third section provides historical Weston birth data and census data on which enrollment projections for future years are based.

### **Section I: Enrollment and October 1 Data**

#### **Table A: preK-12 Enrollment Report**

Overall, we are 5 students above our projection and 53 students below the October 1, 2016 count. The significant variances in the projection figures are apparent in Grades K, 1, 3 and 8.

#### **Table B: preK-12 Enrollment Report Distribution by Residency**

#### **Table C: Trend in Enrollment Distribution by Residency**

Most of the students attending Weston schools are residents, 90.5%. In addition, there are 161 METCO students (7.7%) and 38 children of faculty and staff (1.8%). Over the last 12 years, Weston's enrollment has decreased by 241 students.

#### **Table D: October 1 Fluctuations from Projected Enrollments**

Accurate enrollment projections are challenging. The projection method used by Weston is a commonly used method of calculating the ratio of births to Kindergarten enrollments and grade-to-grade ratios over a period. The birth data source is the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. Table D summarizes the October 1 fluctuations to the projected enrollments. As previous tables have shown, the current year enrollment was more than projected by 5 students. The significant variances in the projection figures are apparent in Grades K, 1, 3 and 8. Actual Kindergarten enrollment was under our projections by 9 students, Grade 1 enrollment was over our projections by 9 students, Grade 3 enrollment was over our projections by 6 students, and Grade 8 enrollment was under our projections by 7 students.

**Table E: Percentage of Weston Resident Children in Private School**

On an annual basis, this district must report to the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) the school placement of Weston resident children. The report is based on data as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year and is due to the DESE at the end of February. Working in conjunction with the Town Clerk, the Business Office matches the information in the districts student information system with the returned census materials. The table outlines the data reported to the DESE for the past eleven years.

This table does not include METCO, exchange, I-20, or tuition students; it reflects the placement of Weston resident children based only on available information.

**Section II: Middle and High School Class Size Review**

**Table F-1: Course Sections Above 25 and Under 12 Students**

Based on a review of the Middle and High Schools course schedule as of September 28, 2017, Table F-1 details courses with enrollments more than 25 students and courses with enrollments less than 12 students.

At the High School, there are zero (0) core courses but nine (9) electives with enrollment more than 25 students. Like past years’ data, many of the music sections, such as concert band and chorus, are by the nature of the discipline, larger than twenty-five students. The High School has eight (8) core courses and three (3) electives with an enrollment under 12 students.

At the Middle School, there are two (2) core courses and twenty-four (24) electives with enrollment more than 25 students. The Middle School has one (1) core course and one (1) elective with an enrollment of 12 students or less as indicated in Table F-1.

A column reflects the time of year the course is running:

All: Year-round course

S1 or S2: Semester 1 or Semester 2

Q1, Q2, Q3, or Q4: Quarter 1, Quarter 2, Quarter 3, or Quarter 4

Due to the nature of smaller classes in special education and topic courses, these courses were not included in the analysis.

**Table F-2: Course Sections Above 25 and Under 15 Students**

During the review, I noticed many classes just above the 12-student minimum number. Below is a table summarizing the data in Table F-2:

School Committee must approve any secondary level course to run under 12 students.

**Table G: Middle School Section Size Distribution**

**Table H: High School Section Size Distribution**

Tables G and H analyze the class size of the core subject areas in the High and Middle Schools.

Table G analyzes the section size distribution for the Middle School. The Middle School courses range from 9 to 28 students per section

Table H analyzes the section size distribution for the High School. English, Social Studies, Math and Science have similar ranges in both the number of sections and size of sections. These range from 8 to 25 students per section

The mean and median calculations are shown on both Table G and H. Table I provides a historical view of these calculations.

**Table I: Section Size Statistics for Certain Departments (Middle and High School)**

Table I provides the statistical data referred to in Tables G and H. The table provides historical class size ranges and mean and median calculations for the Middle and High Schools from school year 2008-2009 through the present. As the table indicates, the historical data has been consistent. Median values range from 17 to 21 over the past two years. The mean values range from 16.8 to 21.0 over the same time.

**Section III: Enrollment Projections**

**Table J: Census and Birth Data**

Table J examines the various attributes contributing to the enrollment projection. The first chart is titled Census of Residents Age 0 – 5 as of January 1. This information is provided by the Town Clerk’s Office on an annual basis. Based on the census figures, the overall population of pre-Kindergarten aged children in Weston has generally declined over the past eighteen years (slight increase in 2001, 2008 and 2010).

The second table provides historical data on the total number of births by Weston residents from 1989 to the present as reported by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH).

**Table K: preK-12 Enrollment History and Projections as of October 1, 2017**

Table K details the enrollment projection methodology. This spreadsheet calculates the ratio of Weston birth data to actual kindergarten enrollments from school year 1998-1999 through the present. The birth data is published annually by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH). Three ratios are then developed: 10-year, 5-year and 3-year for all grades based on average grade retention. Below is a summary of the ratios:

The Kindergarten enrollment figures have fluctuated between 118 and 155 for the past 10 years. There are many ratios one could use to predict the Kindergarten enrollment. Below are a few options that were explored:

Using Weston’s birth and enrollment data:

- 10-year average enrollment: 95.15 Kindergarteners
- 5-year average enrollment: 99.55 Kindergarteners
- 3-year average enrollment: 100.10 Kindergarteners
- 1-year average enrollment: 108.35 Kindergarteners

Statewide birth to Weston Kindergarten ratio:

- 10-year average enrollment: 98.02 Kindergarteners
- 5-year average enrollment: 94.44 Kindergarteners
- 3-year average enrollment: 93.91 Kindergarteners
- 1-year average enrollment: 90.33 Kindergarteners

Based on the data for the past year, the enrollment report anticipates 108 Kindergarten students in 2018 through 2020 then dropping to 107 through 2029. Based on the quality of education provided by the Weston Public Schools, families are apt to move into town when their children reach school age. The 2018-2019 enrollment projections are based on the 1-year ratio using Weston’s data.

## **Summary**

In summary, the school year 2017-2018 enrollments reflect an overall decrease in the number of students attending Weston Public Schools of 53 students.

The school year 2018-2019 enrollment projection is 2,072 students in pre-Kindergarten through Grade 12. This represents a decrease of 32 students from the October 1, 2017 count. I look forward to discussing this with you and providing additional information as needed. Thank you.

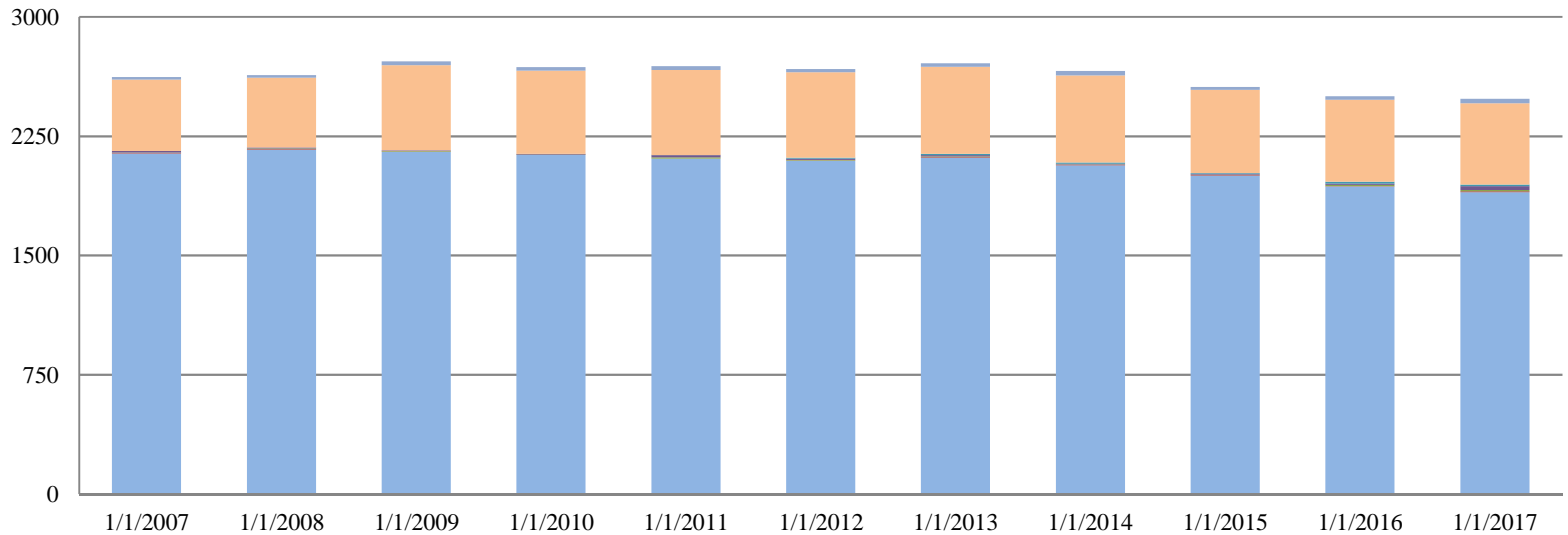

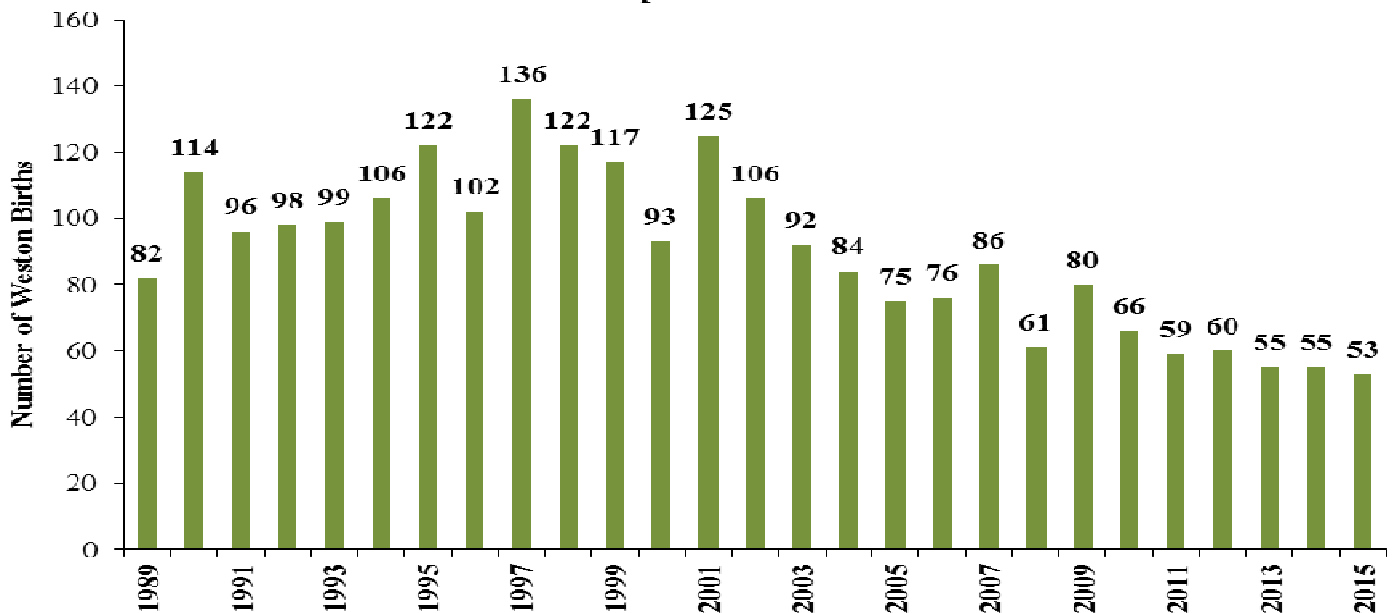
