

The following table compares some of Weston’s peer districts on whether or not they are using a cohort system in their hybrid model. “Cohort” means students come in for alternating days or weeks, such as WMS or WHS. “All-in” means all hybrid students come in at the same time(s), such as our elementary schools. Please note that cohort models and approaches vary widely.

Please note that this is not an official account of any other districts, it is an unofficial snapshot. We intend to continue to update this information and add more districts as we hear from them.

Please note that this is different from the length of the school day, addressed in Table 2 below.
